The Solanco School District educates nearly 3,900 students in four elementary schools (Bart-Colerain, Clermont, Providence and Quarryville), two middle schools (George A. Smith and Swift), and Solanco High School. Geographically, Solanco is the largest district in Lancaster County, encompassing more than 180 square miles. Solanco school buses travel more than 7,000 miles each day during the school year.

Solanco has the lowest property tax rate among all 16 school districts in Lancaster County.

The Solanco School District and the community collaborated to develop Solanco's Core Expectations. They are Respect, Responsibility, Courage and Kindness.
